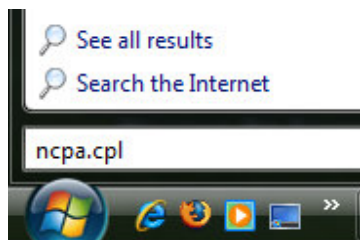


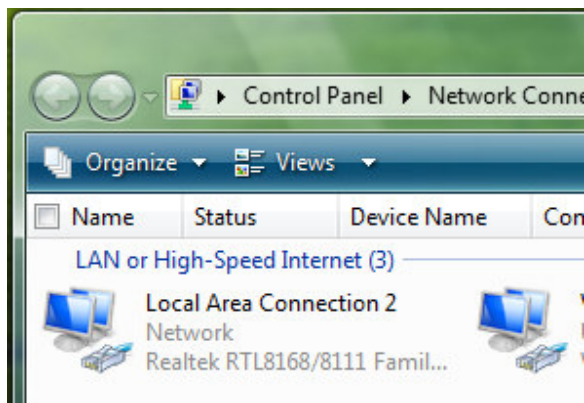
## How to change IP address of your PC/laptop running Windows Vista / 7

Firstly you need to open command prompt (cmd):



- Press **Win+R** and the window will pop up. In the command prompt window, **type in "ncpa.cpl"** no quotes and press enter.
- Or press Start and directly type in "ncpa.cpl" no quotes and press enter.

You should see a new window open with all available network interfaces on this computer. On a laptop there would be at least two: Local Area Connection and Wireless. Sometimes there also could be a mobile phone modem etc.



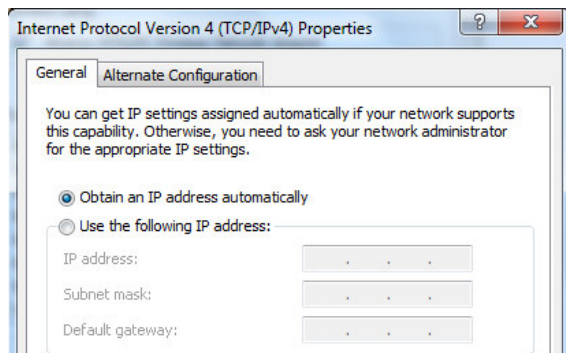
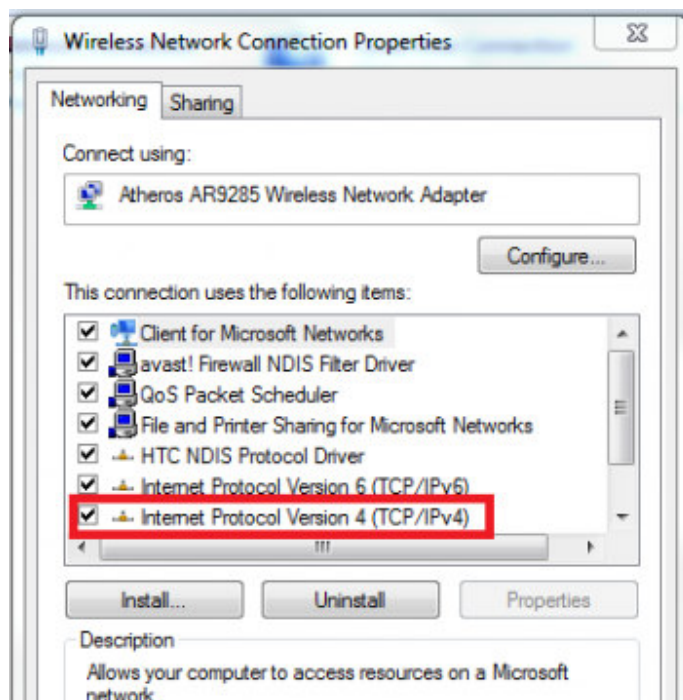
You only need to configure "Local Area Connection" interface (Local Area Connection interface can be also shown as 10/100 Mbit Ethernet etc...).

**Right click on Local Area Connection** and **choose Properties** from a drop down list.

In a new window you'll see few different protocols your Ethernet card supports: xxx, yyy, zzz, **TCP/IPv4**, TCP/IPv6

**Select and Right click on TCP/IPv4 and choose Properties.**

Done – next window will show you IP address of the PC and will let you change it.



### Change IP address

When you are done with changes press OK.

Sometimes network card of your PC doesn't pick up new settings unless you restart the computer, be aware.

*If you set IP address to manual, this PC might not be able to connect to Internet. Change settings back to what it was or choose "Obtain an IP address automatically".*
